NOTICE OF ANNUAL MEETING, BUDGET VOTE, AND ELECTION

FRANKLINVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT FRANKLINVILLE, CATTARAUGUS COUNTY, NEW YORK

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a public hearing of the qualified voters of the Franklinville Central School District, Cattaraugus County, Franklinville, New York, will be held in the Auditorium at Ten Broeck Academy Junior-Senior High School building in said District on Tuesday, May 9, 2023, at 5:30 PM prevailing time, for the presentation of the budget. The budget will be available for review on May 2, 2023, at the District Clerk's Office in the Junior-Senior High School.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the annual meeting of the qualified voters of the Franklinville Central School District of the Town of Franklinville, Cattaraugus County, New York, will be held at the Ten Broeck Academy Junior-Senior High School in said District on Tuesday, May 16, 2023, at 12:00 PM prevailing time, at which said vote and election will be held for eight consecutive hours between the hours of 12:00 PM and 8:00 PM, prevailing time, in the Gymnasium Foyer at Ten Broeck Academy Junior-Senior High School. At that time, the polls will be opened to vote by voting by ballot or machine upon the following items:

To adopt the School District's annual budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 and to authorize the appropriate, the requisite portion thereof to be raised by taxation on the District's taxable property.

To elect one (1) member of the Board for a fiveyear term commencing July 1, 2023, expiring on June 30, 2028, and to succeed Mark Slavinski, whose term expires on June 30, 2023.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a copy of the statement of the amount of money which will be required to fund the School District's budget for 2023- 2024, exclusive of public monies, may be obtained by any resident of the District during business hours beginning fourteen (14) days before the vote, except Saturday, Sunday or holidays Tuesday, May 2, 2023, at the Ten Broeck Academy Junior-Senior High School.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that petitions nominating candidates for the office of the member of the Board of Education shall be filed with the Clerk of said School District at her office in the Junior-Senior High School, not later than Monday, April 17, 2023, between 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM. Each petition shall be directed to the Clerk of the District and shall be signed by at least twenty-five (25) voters of the District, must state the name and residence of the candidate, and shall describe the specific vacancy for which the candidate is nominated.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that applications for absentee ballots will be obtainable between the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM Monday through Friday, except holidays, from the District Clerk. Completed applications must be received by the District Clerk at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter or the day before the election if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. The District Clerk must receive absentee ballots no later than 5:00 PM, prevailing time, on Tuesday, May 16, 2023. A list of persons to whom absentee ballots are issued will be available for inspection to qualified voters of the District in the office of the District Clerk on and after May 10, 2023, between the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM on weekdays before the day set for the annual election and on May 16, 2023, the day set for the election, and said list will be posted at the polling place at the election. Any qualified voter present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds for making their challenge, and the reasons are therefore known to the Inspector of Election before the close of the polls.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that military voters who are not currently registered may apply to register as a gualified voter of the school district. Military voters who are qualified school district voters may apply for a military ballot. Military voters may choose to receive a military voter registration, military ballot application, military ballot by mail, facsimile transmission, or electronic mail in their request for registration, ballot application, or ballot. Military voter registration application forms must be received in the Office of the District Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on April 21, 2023. Military ballot applications must be received in the Office of the District Clerk by mail or in person by also no later than 5:00 p.m. on April 21, 2023. No military ballot will be canvassed unless it is returned by mail or in-person and (1) received in the Office of the District Clerk before the close of the polls on election day and showing a cancellation mark of the United States postal service or a foreign country's postal service, or showing a dated endorsement of receipt by another agency of the United States government; or (2) received by the Office of the District Clerk by no later than 5:00 p.m. on election day and signed and dated by the military voter and one witness, with a date which is associated be not later than the day before the election;

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the qualified voters of the School District are entitled to vote at said annual vote and election. A qualified voter is (1) a citizen of the United States of America, (2) eighteen years (18) of age or older, and (3) a resident within the School District for thirty (30) days preceding the annual vote and election. The School district may require all persons offering to vote at the budget vote and election to provide one form of proof of residency under Education Law §2018-c. Such form may include a driver's license, a non-driver identification card, a utility bill, or a voter registration card. Upon offer of proof of residency, the School District may also require all persons offering to vote to provide their signature, printed name, and address. Any person who would not be gualified to register or vote under the provisions of Election Law Sections 5-100 and 5-106 will not have the right to register for or vote in an election.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to a rule adopted under Education by §2035 and 2008 of the Education Law, any referenda or propositions to amend the budget, otherwise to be submitted for voting at said election, must be filed with the Franklinville Central School District Board of Education at the Regular Meeting on or before April 18, 2023, at 5:00 PM prevailing time; must be typed or printed in English, must be directed to the Clerk of the School District and signed by at least twenty-six (26) qualified voters of the District (representing 5% of the number of voters who voted in the previous annual election); and must state the name and residence of each signer. However, the School board will not entertain any petition to place before the voters any proposition the purpose of which is not within the powers of the voters to determine, or any proposition which fails to include a specific appropriation where the proposition requires the expenditure of monies.

PRIMARY PROJECT:

The Spring Session of Primary Project is now underway with 15 new participants. Our Primary Project debut proved to be a great success. PP students eagerly await each visit to the Cub Cave Playroom. We are seeing improvements in areas such as classroom and peer engagement, attendance, emotional regulation and general interest in school from our Fall participants.

If you haven't heard about Primary Project yet, it's a school-based intervention designed to enhance school related competencies and reduce mild to moderate social, emotional and/or school engagement difficulties in children PreK through 3rd grade. Students appropriate for the program may demonstrate one or more of the following: low engagement in the classroom and/or with peers, shyness, separation anxiety, disinterest in attending school, poor attendance and concerns with managing behavior.
