

NOTICE OF ANNUAL MEETING, BUDGET VOTE, AND ELECTION

FRANKLINVILLE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT FRANKLINVILLE, CATTARAUGUS COUNTY, NEW YORK

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a public hearing of the qualified voters of the Franklinville Central School District, Cattaraugus County, (the "District") Franklinville, New York, will be held in the Auditorium at Ten Broeck Academy Junior-Senior High School building in the District on Tuesday, May 9, 2023, at 5:30 PM prevailing time, for the presentation of the 2023-2024 budget.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Board of Education of the District (the "Board") will have prepared and completed a detailed statement in writing of the amount of money which will be required during the ensuing 2023-2024 fiscal year for school purposes, specifying the several purposes and the amounts for each. The amount for each purpose estimated necessary for payments to boards of cooperative educational services (BOCES) shall be set forth in full with no deduction of estimated state aid. Such statement will be available for review to residents of the District during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. from May 2, 2023 to May 16, 2023 (exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and holidays), at the District Clerk's Office in the Junior-Senior High School.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Annual Meeting and Vote ("Annual Vote") of the qualified voters of the District will be held in the Gymnasium Foyer at the Ten Broeck Academy Junior-Senior High School in the District on Tuesday, May 16, 2023, between the hours of 12:00 PM prevailing time and 8:00 PM, prevailing time, for the purpose of voting on electing one (1) member of the Board of Education of the District ("the Board"), voting on the budget of the District for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, voting on the establishment of a capital improvements reserve fund, and transacting such other business as may be authorized by law.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the election of members of the Board shall be held to fill one (1) position on the Board. The candidate receiving the highest vote total shall be elected to a five-year term (commencing July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2028) to fill the vacancy created by the expiration, on June 30, 2023, of the term of Mark Slavinski.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that petitions nominating candidates for the office of the member of the Board of Education shall be filed with the Clerk of the District at her office in the Junior-Senior High School, not later than Monday, April 17, 2023, between 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM. Each petition shall be directed to the Clerk of the District, shall be signed by at least twenty-five (25) voters of the District, or 2% of qualified voters who voted in the 2022 Annual Vote, whichever is greater, must state the name and residence of the candidate, and shall describe the specific vacancy for which the candidate is nominated.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that voting at the Annual Vote shall consist of the Board election, voting on the following propositions, and voting on any other propositions as may be authorized by law and the rules of the Board to be voted on at such time:

PROPOSITION NO. 1 – 2023-2024 BUDGET Shall the following resolution be adopted?

RESOLVED, that the basic budget for the Franklinville Central School District (the "District") for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024, as presented by the Board of Education, is hereby approved and adopted, and the required funds of \$21,820,556 therefor are hereby appropriated and the necessary real property taxes required shall be raised by a tax on the District's taxable property to be levied and collected as required by law.

PROPOSITION NO. 2– ESTABLISHMENT OF A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS RESERVE FUND

Shall the following resolution be adopted? RESOLVED, that the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Franklinville Central School District, Cattaraugus County, New York (the "District") is hereby authorized to establish a capital improvements reserve fund pursuant to Section 3651 of the Education Law of the State of New York (the "Fund"); that the Fund shall be known as the "Capital Improvements Reserve Fund, 2023" of the District; that the Fund shall be established for the purpose of financing, in whole or in part, the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, expansion, renovation, alteration and improvement of buildings, facilities, sites and real property by the District, or the District's share of the cost of any capital improvements project undertaken by a Board of Cooperative Educational Services ("BOCES") of which the District is (or may become) a component district, including, in all cases, the acquisition of necessary furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus; that the ultimate amount of the Fund shall be not greater than \$5,000,000 (plus interest earned thereon); that the probable term of the Fund shall be not longer than ten (10) years; and that the permissible sources from which the Board is authorized to appropriate monies to the Fund from time to time shall be (A) budgetary appropriations of the District; (B) unappropriated fund balance of the District; (C) State aid received as reimbursement for expenditures by the District in connection with District capital improvements (whether or not such improvements were financed in whole or in part from the Fund); (D) the proceeds from the sale of unneeded real or personal property owned by the District; (E) one or more other reserve funds of the District; and/or (F) such other sources as the Board or the voters of the District may direct from time to time, all as may be permitted by law. AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that applications for absentee ballots may be obtained from the District Clerk between the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM Monday through Friday, except holidays, at her office located in the Junior-Senior High School or by email at: fkeeling@tbafcs.org. Completed applications must be received by the District Clerk at least seven (7) days before the

Annual Vote, if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the Annual Vote, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. The District Clerk must receive absentee ballots no later than 5:00 PM, prevailing time, on Tuesday, May 16, 2023. A list of persons to whom absentee ballots are issued will be available for inspection to qualified voters of the District in the office of the District Clerk on and after May 10, 2023, between the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM on weekdays before May 16, 2023, the day set for the Annual Vote, and said list will be posted at the polling place of the Annual Vote. Any qualified voter present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds for making their challenge, and the reasons are therefore known to the Inspector of Election before the close of the polls.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that military voters who are not currently registered may apply to register as a qualified voter of the District by requesting and returning a military voter registration application to the District Clerk. Completed military voter registration applications must be received in the office of the District Clerk no later than seven (7) days before the election, if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or no later than the day before the vote, if the ballot is to be issued personally to the voter. A military voter may indicate his or her preference for receiving the registration application by mail, facsimile transmission, or e-mail.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that military voters who are qualified voters of the District may apply for a military ballot by requesting an application from the District Clerk. For a military voter to be issued a military ballot, the District Clerk must have received a valid ballot application no later than April 20, 2023. In a request for a military ballot application or ballot, the military voter may indicate their preference for receiving the application or ballot by mail, facsimile transmission, or e-mail.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to a rule adopted under Education by §2035 and 2008 of the Education Law, any referenda or propositions to amend the budget, otherwise to be submitted for voting at the Annual Vote, must be filed with the Board at its Regular Meeting on or before April 18, 2023, at 5:00 PM prevailing time; must be typed or printed in English, must be directed to the Clerk of the District and signed by at least twenty-six (26) qualified voters of the District (representing 5% of the number of voters who voted in the previous annual election); and must state the name and residence of each signer. However, the Board will not entertain any petition to place before the voters any proposition the purpose of which is not within the powers of the voters to determine, or any proposition which fails to include a specific appropriation where the proposition requires the expenditure of monies.
