

I grew up in Houghton and graduated from Fillmore before completing my Bachelor's degree in Psychology at



### FeedMore Food Program

Franklinville Elementary School is continuing to partner with FeedMore of WNY to provide the Weekend Backpack Program to interested families with students in our elementary building. This program provides easily prepared, nutritious foods in take-home bags each Friday throughout the year. Food is non-perishable and consists of 1 vegetable item, 1 fruit item, 1 grain item, 1 dairy item, 1 protein item, 1 breakfast item and 1 snack item. There are no income eligibility

guidelines for participation and it does not affect your family's eligibility for other food assistance programs such as SNAP, WIC or food pantry access. This program is provided free of charge. If you would like more information or would like to sign up please contact Mrs. Kersch the School Social Worker at 716-676-2215. Your family can enroll at any time throughout the school year as well as stop participation if your family no longer needs or wants to participate.

### **Primary Project Program**

We had a successful year #2 of the Primary Project here at the Elementary and we are so excited to continue to offer this great program for eligible students PreK-3rd grade. Through child-led play with our PP trained Child Associate, each participating student has the opportunity to explore their creativity, build their self-confidence and foster positive school relationships. Nurturing a positive connection to school during these formative years becomes

an important building block for future developmental growth and academic success.
